"No!", says the Global Commission on Drug Policy.


"No!", says the think-tank, Australia21.

- Arrest of a drug user can mean ruined life opportunities
- © Criminals and corrupt officials make obscene profits
- Public funds are wasted on ineffective responses

This 100 year experiment has failed and we need to discuss alternatives



Before you vote ask your local candidate if he or she supports a dialogue about alternatives to our prohibition drug laws.

A yes answer is a good reason to vote for that candidate.

Drug issues are implicated in most of our social ills and we need to use the evidence to explore health and social options and not just law enforcement alone to reduce those problems.
